Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking Statement Financial year 2023/24

This statement is made pursuant to section 54 of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and constitutes Climate Hire Group Limited's Slavery and Human Trafficking statement for the financial year ending June 2023.

This statement outlines Climate Hire Group Limited's actions to understand all potential modern slavery risks related to its business and the steps we are taking to ensure that Modern Slavery or Human Trafficking does not take place within our own business or supply chain.

Modern slavery is a crime and a violation of fundamental human rights. It takes various forms, such as slavery, servitude, forced and compulsory labour and human trafficking, all of which have in common the deprivation of a person's liberty by another in order to exploit them for personal or commercial gain.

- Externally via a sub-contractor assessment form and utilising a pre-existing accreditation scheme, Constructionline.
